## Passing of Orrin Sage Jr. and Warren Stone

### **Orrin Grant Sage Jr.**

May 31, 1946 - February 12, 2024

Cindy Sage shared this with us.. *Orrin died unexpectedly Monday afternoon, Feb 12th.* 

He left us peacefully, just slipped away in his sleep. He wasn't sick and had a full morning of working out, driving around fixing rain-rutted roads and 'working' with the dog. He went upstairs to read while I did some chores, and slipped into bed for a nap and didn't wake up No distress on his face. We kept him here for some hours for Amy and Scott and the kids to come and sit and say goodbye. So stunning. So abrupt, but yet, we are grateful he didn't suffer, and in his exacting own way just quietly tiptoed (or flew) up the trail and away. Cindy



Orrin and Cindy both went to Chatsworth Elementary School, Sutter Junior High, Canoga Park High, and then Chatsworth High when it opened. They went through the same schools two years apart. Cindy's family lived on the property adjacent to Lionel Barrymore off of DeSoto. We have enjoyed getting to know them as members of the Chatsworth Historical Society and the opportunity to learn the history of their Sage Ranch property.

In 2017 Al Knight wrote <u>A History of Sage Ranch</u>, available on our Chatsworth Historical Society website under Digital Archives, Publications, Technical Papers. It covers the details of their life, living at the Sage Ranch, raising their family and dealing with the challenges created by the adjacent Santa Susana Field Lab.

## Warren Stone June 9, 1939 - March 25, 2024

Warren passed away on March 25 and will be greatly missed. His dedication and work on behalf of SSMPA-Sky Valley, the FPSSM, the Chatsworth community, and to Twin Lakes his home community since



1981 has been exceptional and greatly appreciated by many. Carla Bollinger sent this photo of them working one of the SSMPA booths and shared..."He leaves his spirit of goodness and community service for all to remember." Warren and his wife Linda (who passed in 2013) were the keepers of the records and had been Board Members for the Twin Lakes Community Association for many years. Their involvement and recordkeeping provided much of the background for the CHS program we were able to provide on the History of Twin Lakes.

Fun Fact: The home they purchased in Twin Lakes was previously rented by The Captain and Tennille. Many people thought The Captain and Tennille had owned Eagles Nest.

In 2012, I contacted Daryl Dragon (aka The Captain) and he confirmed that he had also heard that rumor, but they actually lived on Cree Trail in Twin Lakes, not at Eagles Nest.

## **Andy Griffith Show – Skeet Shooting in Chatsworth Park South**

Last month in March, we presented the 1961 Andy Griffith Show episode that featured Gail Davis and Andy Griffith skeet shooting at the Roy Rogers Sports Center, today's Chatsworth Park South. "Andy Griffith Episode - Skeet Shooting at Chatsworth Park South"



Gail Davis starred in 81 episodes of the "Annie Oakley" TV series from 1954 to 1957. Andy Griffith starred in 249 episodes of the "Andy Griffith Show" TV series from 1960 to 1968.

## In 2016, we made a presentation on "Aqua Sierra and the Roy Rogers Sports Center".



Portions of three undeveloped homestead parcels were combined from 1951 to 1969 to create the 127-acre sports center at the west end of Devonshire, on what is today's Chatsworth Park South and part of Rockpointe. The Sports Center included a Shooting Range, Golf Courses, and Fishing Lakes.

#### **Chatsworth Park Closure**

For those that don't remember, Chatsworth Park South was closed February 14, 2008, because of reported lead contamination on a portion of the acreage due to skeet shooting.

Remediation work (grading, storm water controls, capping the surface soil, and trails improvement, refreshing of park equipment, etc.) began in early April 2016.

On August 31, 2017, after 3,485 days of closure, Los Angeles Department of Recreation and Parks along with City Council District 12 Officially Re-Opened Chatsworth Park South.

#### **Chatsworth Park Memories – Tim Bowman**

Recent member Tim Bowman, friend of Buck Barker of the Munch Box, shared some memories with us

I grew up in Chatsworth on Mason Avenue at 9625, just north of Plummer St. In those days our five-acre property was called Twin Barns Ranch. At Plummer and Mason on the NW corner there was a ten-acre parcel owned by Al Severance our neighbor. There was no house on his walnut tree covered property. Our property was the next five acres, Twin Barns Ranch. Walnut tree covered. Two houses at 9601 & 9625. My dad William J. Bowman and my grandfather William A. Eull harvested walnuts and raised 10,000 chickens. I attended Chatsworth Park Elementary school at Topanga Cyn. Blvd. & Devonshire in the fifties. Devonshire & Topanga was a two-lane concrete intersection then. From my classroom window I could see the old five shoot palm tree that was on the edge of the Topanga Cyn. Blvd. sidewalk. It was saved and moved near to the school building when Topanga was widened. Is the palm tree still there? Well, I've gotten long winded!

I am now going through old photos I have of my early days on the ranch and will forward them to you. Thank you all. Tim Bowman.

## The beginnings of the Lionel Barrymore Estate – The George Reay Ranch

Tom Reay contacted us in March 2024 to share some photos of his great-grandfather George Reay's ranch in Chatsworth, in Brown's Canyon. George Reay sold the ranch to Lionel Barrymore. In 1938, at the age of 60,

Lionel purchased 22 acres in Brown's Canyon at 11050 Independence Ave, Chatsworth.



At left, a 1926 photo of George Reay (1872-1941) at the "ranch" before it was sold to Lionel Barrymore in 1938. The photo shows a wooden building/shed in the shade of two huge sycamore trees. And another smaller building back against the hillside further east that looks like an outhouse.

They lived in downtown Los Angeles and motored out to enjoy their ranch property. Other photos include hiking in Brown's Canyon and visiting the 1896 Chatsworth DeSoto Dam, which still exists today north of the end of DeSoto Ave.




The photo at right shows Tom's grandmother Faye Reay cooking on an


outdoor fire, in front of the shed, labeled "At the Ranch, Easter Sunday, 1925

The photo at left is a general view of the ranch, from August 8<sup>th</sup>, 1926, looking east. The flat plain with the huge sycamores in the background (in the middle of the picture) is where the 1926 shed, and Lionel's










sycamores, looking west.

At left is a 1929 photo of Tom's father, George Farris Reay (1927-2008), sitting on a meat packing box in front of the sycamores looking east.

The location today is just north of the Sierra Canyon football field.
