AN APPEAL FOR THE RED CROSS

YOUR PRESIDENT SAYS:

WHITE HOUSE, MAY 10, 1917.—"I have today created within the Red Cross a War Council to which will be entrusted the duty of responding to the extraordinary demands the ou the duty of responding to the extraordinary demands the present war will make upon the services of the Red Cross both in the field and in civilian relief and I hereby earnestly call upon all who can contribute either great sums or small to the alleviation of the suffering and distress which must inevitably arise out of this fight for humanity and democracy. to contribute to the Red Cross.

"Wherefore, by virtue of my authority as President of the United States, and as President of the American Red Cross, I, Woodrow Wilson, do hereby proclaim the week beginning June 18, 1917, as Red Cross week, during which the people of the United States will be called upon to give generously and in a spirit of patriotic sacrifice for the support and maintenance of this work of national need."
