Half Rat Water for Irrigation Granted to May 1st Sign Petition for Next Winter

The Board of Supervisors granted the half rate for irrigating water to May 1st, before the water of the past rain storm started. The rain will not make the use of irrigating water necessary as it will have been had it not rained; however, any considerable more rain is necessary for planting. Farmers are planning on using large amounts of water on their alfalfa, beans and feed land so to have it well soaked up.

Winter crops are necessary in this valley to supplement summer crops and the water of the past rain to farm land that is as high priced as it is scarce. The water on the lands in this valley does. Winter crops are necessary for the irrigator. Irrigation in October can be saved until later in the year. A petition is being circulated to get into court for a permanent rate for next year, now which will give the farmers the half rate on water. A petition for crops for eight months (September to March) is being circulated to plan for such a crop in advance, a petition is now being circulated. Tea and Club Rooms Opened for American Women.

Miss Charlotte Niren, Director of Italian Work, Prepares for influx of American Women Students.

Italy is now included in the war work of the American Y. W. C. A.

Miss Mabel Warner of Salt Lake, Kan., and Chicago left Paris a few days ago for Rome, where she will be in charge of a Hostess House for American girls employed there by the American Red Cross.

Miss Warner will open a tea room and club rooms where the American women can gather for social times.

Rome is harboring a refuge population of about 40,000 and accommodations are difficult to find.

The work in Rome was started as a direct result of the appeal of Miss Charlotte Niren, one of the National Y. W. C. A. secretaries in Italy, who is spending a few months in France as advisor in the French work.

Miss Niren's dream of Y. W. C. A. work in Italy includes the establishment of a residence for non-Italian women, who, she feels, will come to Italy in great numbers after the war to study music and art.

"I believe at this time such a project is particularly important because women from other countries should be encouraged to come to Italy to replace the great numbers of German women who flooded Italy in the past, many of them paid agents of their governments."

Miss Niren said in discussing her plan.
