HEAVY CANNON NOT NEW.
 Armed Under Big Caliber Guns in the Fourteenth Century.

Although one is accustomed to hear of the immense size of the heavy artillery used in modern warfare, it should be borne in mind that projectiles of even larger diameter were used long ago.

The first piece of artillery recorded was made by Schwartz, a German, soon after the invention of gunpowder in 1330, while the first use of artillery in warfare was probably made by the Moors of Algiers, Spain, in 1363. The town is situated on the same bay and opposite to Gibraltar.

Edward III, at Crecy, in 1346, had four pieces of cannon, and he also used artillery at the siege of Calais in the following year.

In Stoloburg, to which it was transferred from London at the request of Sir Walter Scott, may be seen Mons Meg, a large cannon thirteen feet long and twenty inches bore. It was said to have been used by James II, at the siege of Thistle Castle in 1455. This gun was used about thirty years later the king met his death at Bosworth in the burning of a similar cannon, the Lion.

The largest recorded is a gun which was used in the battle of Beagopier, India, during the seventeenth century and known as 'Lord of the Plains.' By some authorities it has been taken to have come out of India and by others of bronze.

Cast iron cannons were not made until the latter part of the fifteenth century. Previously they were always made of bronze. At the Battle of Marston in 1141, nearly 700 years after the introduction of cast iron for guns, the question may be genuinely open to doubt.

So that as it may, the projectile fired by the gun weighed 1,600 pounds, and at that time it must have been a formidable weapon. The 111 ton gun of the Bombay, a British battleship built in 1880, used a projectile of 1,800 pounds. Daily purchased in 1884 from the Krupp firm a 119 ton gun and the same firm six years later made a 135 ton gun, which is now mounted at the head of the gulf of Finland, in Russia.—London Chronicle.

FAMOUS WAR FLAG FOR FIRST STATE IN VICTORY LOU

Emblem that Flew When War Was Declared to Go to State With Best Record

The flag that floated over the capitol building at Washington when Congress declared on October 31st, will be presented to the state attaining the highest percentage of participation of its people in the Victory Loan. Already it is being sent to the State.

Not only was this flag flown during the passage of the war resolution, but also before the first issue of the President Wilson's second Inaugural March 4, 1917, and the second time when the president was making his last appearance before the Senate on December 21, 1917.

MILITARY INSIGNIA.

Marks which tell the rank and service of the Wearer.

In all branches of the military service, infantry, cavalry and artillery, the same symbols of insignia of rank are used. The corporal, at the bottom of the scale of officers, is distinguished from the private by the device, consisting of two bars on the right sleeve. In the case of the sergeant, next higher in rank, the chevrons is of three inverted V-shaped bars. All enlisted men, including privates, are distinguished by chevrons, worn on one side of their coats or blouse, a brass button with the rank is in relief crossed rifles for the infantry, crossed muskets for the cavalry and crossed cannons for the artillery. Coast and field artillerymen are distinguished by the fact that in case of the former, in addition to the emblem, there is a shell at point of the intersection of the cannon.

The second lieutenant, lowest in rank of the commissioned officers, may be distinguished from the enlisted man by the fact that he wears no insignia on his shoulder straps, or on his collar. That symbol, as in the case of the enlisted man, is of crossed rifles, and is worn by all officers, according to the branch of service, and is worn by all enlisted officers. On the other side of the collar are the letters "N." in gold. Infantry officers may be distinguished from the enlisted men by the fact that the latter wear no insignia on their collar, and the enlisted men by the fact that they wear no insignia on their collar, and the enlisted men by the fact that they wear no insignia on their collar.

First lieutenants have a silver bar on their shoulder straps, while captains have two bars. Of the field officers the major wears a gold leaf, the lieutenant colonel a silver leaf and the colonel a gold leaf. The brigadier general has one silver star, and the major general has two stars. The campaign hats—broad brimmed felt hats—worn by all officers to the arm to which the wearer belongs. The hats of all colored men are also, but the last card around the crown reveals of his color the brim of the service to which he now belongs. A blue cord signifies infantry, a yellow cord cavalry and a red cord for the artillery.
