GATHERING OF PEACHES

Peach and Pear Harvest in Its Prime

Surprising Yields Prove Wonderful Value of Valley Soil

The early peach harvest has featured the harvest of pears, which are being gathered this week. It is one of the biggest years in the history of the valley.
