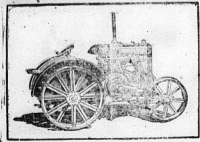

BUI WARK AGAINST WINTER SHORTAGE

Some Facts About Cold Storage and the Charges of Manipulation and Exorbitant Prices.

Once again the subject of cold storage has come into the line of public attention; and this time in connection with the nation-wide youth strike for the cause of the high cost of living.

There can be no argument to be had of knowing and holding back from supplies for speculative profits. But this is a matter quite apart from the true and legitimate purpose of cold storage, which is to prevent the loss of the much agitated and damaging poultry which has continued about the subject from time to time, the real average performing function of cold storage has been largely obscured.

Lying in Winter Stocks. City people, and even country who people, have long since forgotten, under the conditions of modern life, that there was a time in the history of our country when "lying in a winter's stock" denoted, upon each household individually. Today, one who even dares to remember, says are not all year-around products that better is produced in great amount in the winter, and does this winter, and few would be completely surprised to find that even milk production has its seasons of scarcity. The buyers for the household in the days simply go to the store, say to the year, expecting to find them and similar commodities on the market.

Are Storages Prevented? However, we are told that storage of commodities are not so common at the present as the normal as compared with the past. It has been estimated that the combined capacity of a storage of winter stock is 19 per cent. While on the face of it this looks the most reasonable of reserves, yet it must be remembered that commodities that are stored are not so plentiful. Demands for a great number of commodities are increasing tremendously. Our experts for June were double what they were a year ago, and 40 per cent of these exports were foodstuffs.

Moreover, our reserves last year were inadequate. Those who recall some of the extraordinary prices of certain foods last winter and spring know precisely what it means to have too small holdings of reserves. That we are better prepared for next winter than we were last fall should not be used as the basis of a wholesale condemnation of our methods of providing for our future wants.

How Prices Are Determined. Cold storage has been criticized as an instrumentality that lends itself easily to the taking of unfair profits. Without a question its ability to store has been greatly exaggerated. Storage warehouses are scattered throughout all portions of the United States, and there are now being built by thousands of competing firms and individuals. The fact that the storage capacity of the country consists of public warehouses that store space is available in small lots or big ones. "Unlimited" figures of the capacity in storage are therefore, and disseminated by the government monthly report, are not to be taken as anything more than figures against which should be made a comparison during those months (or the estimated months) that are later for prices.

See Figures on Profit. But the best information as to profits in the cold storage business consists of actual figures and such are published regularly by the Federal Reserve Board in its monthly report. For instance, that in the season of 1915-16, the average price of July at an average of 36.64 cents a pound, sold at an average of 27.65 cents a pound, giving a gross profit of 0.91 cent on a pound, and in 1917-18 it was 5.28 cents. These gross amounts must be compared with the net profit on the same lot up for several months; but the net profits are amplified and it is apparent from these figures that storing of foods is not a profitable business. It is a business that is not a speculation, but a business that is a necessity for the people, and affords an average profit of 10 per cent on the value of the goods that are stored. Extravagant charges of manipulation and control of prices are propositions absent in view of these seasons of losses. The ups and downs of the market are due to the season of the year; for the best foodstuffs of the year can not be stored, but the surplus may well start the market to higher prices, but when a cold supply that will not cut current production. The increased demand for those Government securities, the Treasury Savings Certificate being the most popular, was made apparent by the fact that the Federal Reserve Bank supplied \$200,000 worth of Treasury Savings Certificates to eight banks in the district on November 28, which is the largest amount in one day since the close of the war. On the face of the demand for these eighteen banks and the increased call for the securities from all post offices throughout the Twelfth Federal Reserve District, it would seem that the Government's holiday gift campaign will be a success.

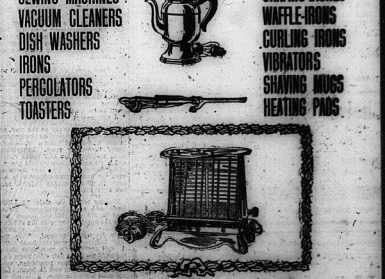
