#### AGRICULTURE REPORT

Aeriferaria in California may account upon application copies of the annual report of the College of Agriculture of the University of California, Department of the State University for the past year, being in an announcement made by Don Thomas Purdy, Head. Results of investigations have been reported on 113 crops, including experiments with cereals, tubers and potatoes, peas, alfalfa, hops, farm animals, poultry, animal diseases and other agricultural matters. ## The Kitchen Cabinet

"SOMETHING TO BUY."

For those who like the old-fashioned butternut soup, the following recipe will appeal to you.  
**Milked Butternut.**—Take two cups of butternut, 1 1/2 cups of milk, 1/2 cup of butter, 1/2 cup of sugar, 1/2 cup of flour, 1/2 cup of salt, 1/2 cup of cream, 1/2 cup of milk, 1/2 cup of butter, 1/2 cup of sugar, 1/2 cup of flour, 1/2 cup of salt, 1/2 cup of cream, 1/2 cup of milk.

**Caraway Bread.**—Put two cups of whole milk on two tablespoons of sugar, one teaspoonful of salt, and two tablespoons of shortening; add two tablespoons of caraway seed, and mix well. Dissolve in half a cupful of salt water. Then add six cupsful of flour, two tablespoons of caraway seed, and mix well. Add one-half cupful of whole wheat flour. Rise and bake in loaves.

**Brown Nut Bread.**—Take two cupsful of butternut, two cupsful of whole flour, one cupful of whole flour, one-half cupful of molasses, one tablespoonful of sugar, one teaspoonful of salt, one-half teaspoonful of soda, one-half cupful of raisins, one and one-half cupful of whole wheat flour. Mix and bake in loaves.
