the Stock that was on Hand.

The Owensmouth warehouse of the Fernando Valley Feed and Feel Co. is shipping 28 carloads consisting of 18,of 2 sacks of Teyary beans to Hamburg, Germany, on orders of the G. S. Sterns people of San Francisco.

The Van Nuys warehowse of the Fernando Valley Feed and Fuel companys has loaded out 6 cars of 4522 sacks, leaving about 4500 sacks on hand there, practically all of which have been sold and are out of the

This makes a total of 42 carloads to be shipped on the order and cleans up practically half of the holdovers in the valley, and as no more of this variety of bean is being grown there can be no further accumulation.

All of the baby limas have been sold so that this year's crop will practically come into a cleaned up market.




