**LOS ANGELES HEALTH DEPT. PERACUTIONS**  
 AGAINST MILD DOGS

Robert or hydrophobia has related  
 to be within the last few weeks the  
 disease has again increased. The  
 number of mad dogs and the number  
 of persons bitten by mad dogs in  
 California in 1921 was 22 and 22  
 deaths in 1922, a total of 44 deaths  
 in 1922, and at the present time  
 persons who have been bitten by  
 mad dogs are receiving the Pasteur  
 treatment in this city. Owners of  
 dogs are notified that they must  
 have their dogs vaccinated and  
 the health laboratory of the State  
 at the Pacific Fisheries Building.

The necessity of enforcing the  
 ordinance prohibiting the disease is  
 obvious. Any dog which is  
 reported or properly suspected of  
 being a mad dog must be  
 immediately confined in the
