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# RADIO POSITION AND SIZE OF GRID IMPORTANT

Determine Value of Negative Potential Necessary to Reduce the Plate Current to Zero

In using a three-electrode vacuum tube in a radio set it is preferred to maintain the grid potential at a constant distance in order to reduce the distance to zero in the control of the plate current. The constant position of the grid with respect to the filament and the plate will also be the same as the

with increasing frequency of the AC the negative potential which must be applied to the grid is reduced to reduce the plate current to zero. The value of  $V_g$  which is the positive grid control that will cause the maximum reduction current to flow in the plate circuit, is also determined by the relative positions of the grid with respect to the filament and plate. If the grid is very close to the plate, the value of  $V_g$  will be small, and the value of  $V_g$  will be large when the grid is far from the plate.

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**RADIO DOOTS**  
Don't expect the amount to be an exact figure. It is a rough estimate. Keep the ratio of 1 to 10 as near constant as possible while tuning.

**"The Line  
 Is Busy"**

When the telephone operator tells you  
 "the line is busy," this fact has been made  
 known to her by an electric signal. With  
 thousands of calls in daily telephone  
 traffic, if the operator, to secure this in-  
 formation, were compelled to listen on  
 the line of the party called, prompt service  
 would be out of the question.

This delay is eliminated by an electric  
 device which in the fraction of a second  
 automatically indicates that the line  
 called for is in use.

When "busy" reports are repeated on  
 successive calls for the same number, it is  
 generally due to an immediate use of the  
 line called. The length of a telephone  
 conversation is obviously beyond the control  
 of the telephone operator. Have confidence  
 in her when she makes the report "the line  
 is busy."
