VOTE FOR ELECTRIC BONDS

That the City's municipal electric system is saving the people of Los Angeles more than \$100,000 annually in their electric bills because of the low rates maintained, as compared with rates paid by a private power company just outside the City limits, is being pointed out today by Chief Electrical Engineer E. F. Scarborough of the Power Bureau.

Mr. Scarborough further drew attention to the fact that the same measurable development of power along the aqueduct has been effected. In this connection, he emphasized the vital importance of the voters of Los Angeles electing bonds for the Electric Bonds (Proposition 6) on the June election ballot.

It is of vital importance that the City of Los Angeles develop a large and large supply of cheap electric energy to meet a demand for electric service that is now increasing at the rate of 25 per cent annually, said Mr. Scarborough.

"The City's municipal electric system has proved to be a splendid business for the people. The Bureau of Power and Light is paying all interest and principal charges on outstanding electric bonds out of revenues, as well as other expenses, and at the same time is serving the people at an extremely low rate.

"In the same way, the \$15,000,000 bond issue will not even the taxpayer one cent, because all interest and principal payments will be made out of electric revenues, returned under the present law rates.
