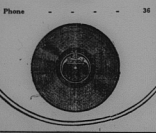

## BOY SCOUT HEROES

"The boy scout movement takes a boy at the age when he craves the opportunity to translate words into deeds," says an observer, "and it is through the incidents of youthful bravery and self-sacrifice that the ideals for which scouting stands."

The following list of heroic acts are typical.

In the fall of 1919, Scouts Maurice Shaskan and Irving Baker of Brunswick, together with Arthur A. Meisel, a painter, recently saved a bedridden invalid from being burned to death when a fire broke out in the building in which her apartment was located. The boys, in passing, were attracted by the smoke. Calling to the painter, who was working nearby, the boys made their way into the burning building. The flames drove the boys back when they reached the second landing. Meisel continued on to the third floor, reaching Mrs. Shaskan, as the flames were licking the posts of the bed on which she was lying helplessly. Meisel picked the woman up and carried her to the second floor, where Father and Shaskan found her and helped in carrying the invalid from the building.

"Because his older brother passed away about a year ago," says the Detroit Evening News, "the late little Edward Scott of Plamouth, Mich., is truly brave." The boy, now nine, accompanied by a companion, were returning home along an intersection when the companion stepped on the third rail. The lad was knocked down and rolled under the rail, where his body was terribly burned. Seeing that companion dead, the boy, the scout pulled his brother's unconscious form from under the rail and carried it down to the street. Then the scout held the smaller boy's limp form in the cold water until he revived, and upon the arrival of the physician the scout assisted in dressing the burns.

A quarry hole at Westport, N. J., might have been fatal to local Mayor, for the training and presence of mind of Scout de Vere Laing.

With some other boys, the scout, following a baseball game, went camping in the quarry hole. Suddenly one of the group, Thomas Leubach, suddenly becoming paralyzed in the odd position, began to strangle. The scout dived in after him and, as Leubach was about to go under the third line, succeeded in helping the unconscious boy to breathe. Laing worked on the protrusion form of his companion, pumped the water from the lady's lungs and finally succeeded in rescuing him to consciousness. After a short rest Leubach was able to return to his home.

## TYPICAL SCOUT GOOD TURN

A spirit of charity in the way of a coat of whitewash was recently spread over all the shabby homes, trees, trunks and outcrops along the city of Allenton, Wis., by the scouts in a recent cleanup campaign. The scouts received the official thanks of the city and in addition, four prizes were awarded to many groups for their outstanding work. Troop No. 10, which mended the whitewash and therefore had not the time to compete in applying it, was awarded the consolation prize.

"The work of the scouts having the clean-up campaign in charge was declared a big success," says the Allenton Daily Reporter. "Some realizers who saw the boys whitewashing were so impressed by the work that they volunteered to remunerate the scouts for their work, but of course, no money was taken, as it is one of the laws of scouting that no boy accept in his name any pay for any act of kindness and help done."
