RURAL FIRE PROTECTION

C. H. Landsberg, chairman of the
Farm Bureau committee on Fire Pro-
tection, announces that organiza-
tions in rural districts of Los Angeles
county are to have better fire protec-
tion. The District Forester, Shelo
Allen, is cooperating with the Farm
Bureau committee in efforts toward
better placarding of canyons and work
is being planned for location of fire
fighting strategic points. County
Forester Fleishman is planning on the
distribution of a dozen tractors com-
pletely equipped to various parts of
the county where the need is greatest
and is cooperating with the Farm
Bureau in ascertaining the exact loca-
tions where tractors are to be
placed. Several Farm Bureau centers
have organized local fire protection
associations and are taking over the
trains. Although many more are in-
stated than many parts of the state
Los Angeles county farmers feel the
necessity for greater fire protection
especially since last year's disastrous
forest fires.

TREATMENT OF POISON OAK
The extremely volatile oil which is so readily transferred to the skin or clothing of the passerby who brushes against the poison oak plant penetrates the skin very easily and causes the acute irritation. Immediately after exposure to poison oak the individual should wash with a strong alkali solution followed by a dousing with halogen solution. If this does not give relief the application of alcohol or acetone is advised. The use of great quantities of salves should be avoided as they only aggravate the irritation.

The KITCHEN CABINET

GOOD THINGS TO EAT.

A salad is always enjoyed and any new combination welcomed.

Cheese Salad—Take half a pound of fine American cheese one cream cheese, two tablespoons of cream, two green peppers and one fourth onion chopped fine. Rub the cream cheese, cream and grated or sliced American cheese to a smooth paste. Add the finely chopped onion, a stalk of celery and the peppers all finely minced. Season with pepper, add salt and egg yolk and mix into a hot buttered cracker.

Salad with Rice—Cut the white meat of one chicken and one lobster into dice. Put two tablespoons of sweet fat into a shallow frying pan, add one sweet green pepper and one sweet red pepper chopped fine; stir until they are soft. Add the lobster and chicken, one teaspoonful of salt, but slowly, until a cupful of sauce is made. Season to taste. Put two cupfuls of hot seasoned rice in the center of a platter, put the meat mixture over the top and pour over the tomato sauce and add to the table.

Cauliflower Caper—Pick over salt cauliflowers and separate into small pieces. Measure two-thirds of a cupful. Cover with salted water, cook until tender and drain. Out four medium-sized cooked potatoes into slices, arrange in a layer of salt and pepper; repeat over one and one-half cupfuls of tomato sauce, sprinkle with buttered crumble and brown in a moderate oven.

Venetian Sauce—Melt one-fourth of a cupful of butter, add four table spoonfuls of flour and stir until well blended; then pour on gradually boiling water. Bring to boiling point and add the juice of half a lemon, one-fourth of a cupful of pepper, one tablespoonful of finely chopped parsley and two tablespoonfuls of finely chopped pickles. Again bring to the boiling point, season with salt and add one tablespoonful of butter by bit.
