Graywolf and Alfred Panther are curators of the Chumash Indian Museum, 3290 Lang Ranch Pkwy, Thousand Oaks, CA 91362

Graywolf is dedicated to the historical site and living history center, restoring and preserving Chumash historical, cultural, and the natural environ-ment. As curator he has dedicated his life to conducting educational programs including school field trips, building historical-cultural exhibits for the museum and creating handcrafted artifacts and crafts.

In addition to his partnership with Alfred Panther as Museum Curators, they have the only native owned company that does casting, wardrobe

and props for TV and Motion Pictures. Graywolf made the bone hair pin for Johnny Depp's role in Pirates of the Caribbean! And, just to fill every minute in a significant way, Graywolf and Panther have a Blues Band, Graywolf is lead guitar and Panther plays Native American drums.

Graywolf will discuss the history, culture and current events of the Chumash Indians and will demonstrate using tools and toys.



This summer, the National Park Service initiated a new "special resource study" of the **Rim of the Valley Corridor** surrounding the San Fernando, La Crescenta, Santa Clarita, Simi and Conejo Valleys in Los Angeles and Ventura Counties of southern California. The Rim of the Valley Corridor study's purpose is to determine whether any portion of the study area is eligible to be designated as a unit of the national park system or added to an existing national park such as the Santa Monica Mountains National Recreation Area. The study will also explore other ways that private or governmental entities can protect resources and provide more outdoor recreation opportunities.

As we begin the study, we are building an email list of people who are interested in the study process or in the outcome of the study. To that end we would like to invite you to <u>register for email alerts on our website</u>. People on our email list will receive notices of <u>upcoming meetings</u> and <u>current newsletters</u> summarizing the <u>study process</u> and draft findings when they are available. Making it Happen - SSMPA follows our Vision and Mission with great results!

Your membership and contributions help SSMPA preserve and protect the Santa Susana Pass State Historic Park and surrounding open space. State budget cuts earmarked our Santa Susana Pass State Historical Park for closure. SSMPA Board Members, with the active support and assistance of local state park officials, set up a call to action and enlisted over 60 votimeers! We learned from California State Parks that there were 38 very active Volunteers in that logged 1,433 hours between January - June, 2010! Fourteen of these volunteers have earned District passes. There are two volunteers who contributed more than 100 hours! SSMPA achieved our goal beyond our own expectations! More to come in future months!

SSMPA is currently working on these projects:

- The Chatsworth Nature Preserve remains an open space preserve to protect cultural & historical assets, keep the area a vital Canada Goose migratory sanctuary, as well as a wildlife preserve for hundreds of other birds and wildlife.

- We are working with Boeing/NASA/DOE as SSFL is cleaned up to standards set by CA State TOWARD THE GOAL that one day the area becomes an open space park –(crucial to the Rim of the Valley Wildlife Corridor)- Rim of the Valley Wildlife Corridor (ROV) is another project that we will partner with other community leaders to make happen, which includes a related objective to set aside open space in this area so wildlife will have a connecting trail between all the surrounding mountain ranges to ensure their survival. People, too, will have places to hike, ride horses and bikes, and be able to enjoy our beautiful foothills and mountains for generations to come.

- State Park Visitor Center: The Visitor Center is in place and display cabinets are moved in – it is located between the Chatsworth Historical Society and the Recreation Center in Chatsworth Park South. It will be months before electrical hook up and displays are set up but there has been great progress!
