Filming The Roy Rogers Show on Roy & Dale's Chatsworth Ranch


"The Roy Rogers Show" ran for six seasons on NBC, from 1951-1957.

- Most of its location footage was shot on the Iverson Movie Ranch in Chatsworth.
- Another filming location was Corriganville in Simi Valley.
- The famous Double R Bar Ranch gate from the TV show was set up at still another filming location — Disney's Golden Oak Ranch in Placerita Canyon, Newhall.
- Roy and Dale moved to their Chatsworth Ranch in 1955, and filming for a few episodes of seasons 5 and 6 of "The Roy Rogers Show" was at their new Chatsworth Ranch.


- The inspiration for this presentation is a recent blog post by Chatsworth film historian Dennis Liff. This presentation will include discussion of:
 - Roy & Dale's Chatsworth Ranch at 9839 Andora
 - The location of the "Double R Bar Ranch" (which was not where Roy and Dale lived).
 - A fun look at Double R Bar Ranch merchandising.
 - Filming locations at the Chatsworth Ranch, that will soon be developed into 33 homes at the end of Andora.
 - A review of scene locations from the 1956 episode "False Faces" filmed at the Chatsworth Ranch, followed by watching the 22 minute episode.

Roy and Dale moved to Chatsworth in the summer of 1955, after filming 4 seasons of The Roy Rogers Show. Their ranch was at 9839 Andora.

Roy and Dale hadn't bought the place yet when this 1952 aerial shot was taken over Chatsworth, but when they bought it three years later, it came with a significant drive from the Andora gate to the 1938 house.



A 1962 ucsb aerial shows the same driveway off of Andora to the 137 acre Roy Rogers ranch.

A barn, corrals, and outbuildings are along the east side of the driveway.

A water feature is seen below the house. Cheryl Rogers has mentioned having a "lake out in front of the house."


Notice the meadow below and to the west of the house.



Beginning in 1964, a portion of the former ranch property was subdivided and developed as Roy Rogers Ranchos.

The photo at right shows that the old driveway no longer exists.

The house where Roy and Dale lived remains intact, at 22801 Trigger St.



1964 Tract TR0733-065, Roy Rogers Ranchos, 33 acres, 54 homes

- Originally announced in 1963, the project was to include a natural lake-type swimming pool, tennis courts, and play area.
- The project also announced fully equipped barns and boarding facilities for horses, and that Rogers will maintain his family home on a seven acre estate in the heart of the project.


- The project was kicked off with roping ceremonies in April, 1964.
- In August 1964, tragedy befell the Rogers, as their 12 year old daughter Debbie was killed in a bus accident.
- In 1965, Roy and Dale sold the remainder of their ranch and moved to Apple Valley, Ca. near Victorville.








"The Roy Rogers Show" gate at the Double R Bar Ranch

One "Roy Rogers Show" location that generated more interest than most — along with more confusion than any other — was a fictional place called the "Double R Bar Ranch."

Notice the brand in each corner of the sign. There is a "bar" under the two R's.



By the mid-1950s, Roy Rogers and his TV ranch had become the focus of a massive merchandising operation, which might help explain some of the mythology surrounding the ranch..

Lookee, that's excitement like you never did see in this here Happi-Time set. A bunkhouse, hosses with removable saddles. 8 cowpokes including Roy Rogers and lots more at this low price.

The centerpiece of the Roy Rogers marketing empire was the Happi-Time Double R Bar Ranch playset.

The TV show had kids convinced that Roy and Dale lived on the Double R Bar, and the playsets flew off the shelves.

The marketers weren't about to pour cold water on any existing hype that might help sell playsets — for example by clarifying that Roy and Dale didn't really live on the Double R Bar.



At one time you could rock out on Trigger as long as you had a spare quarter.


Of course, the mechanical Trigger was also branded "Double R Bar Ranch" and featured yet another rendition of the famous gate.






