COUNTY ORDINANCE N. 137. Passed by the County Board of Supervisors on 2/6/79. It is an urgency ordinance for a period of 4 months. At the end of that time another hearing will be scheduled in front of the County Board of Supervisors for a continuation of time. It protects all but 5 oak trees on each parcel of land until a permanent permit procedure for all oaks can be prepared and passed. We urge rapid accelleration of this ordinance.

Miss Watts grew up in Chatsworth and attended Columbus Junior High and Chatsworth High School before accepting a Ford Foundation Scholarship at age 15 to attend the official school of the New York City Ballet, the School of American Ballet and continuing high school at New York's Professional Children's School.

She was invited to join the company at age 17 and continued her training in the

corps de ballet. During the last three years she has danced principal roles in most of the ballets in the company's repertory.

In 1977, Danish dancer and choreographer Peter Martins created his first ballet on Miss Watts and Daniel Duell titled "Calcium Light Night," to the music of Charles Ives. The ballet received wide critical acclaim for the dancers and the choreographer and is now in the company's repertory. This season Miss Watts was cast by Jerome Robbins as the soloist in the "Winter" sequence of his new ballet, "The Four Seasons," and it too was greeted well by the
