
News

The news that you have all been wanting to know about -- "What were the final results of the yard sale?" \$3000.75. It was broken down in this way -- \$86 from the cream cheese pies made and sold by Marlys Stuckenbruck, \$130 from donations, \$1694.75 from yard sale on Sat. & Sun., \$1050 sold by Ioline and Everett -articles taken to swap meets and antique shows - items that weren't sold at the yard sale. That adds up to \$2960.75, then Ioline added a \$40.00 check to make the total \$3000.75. As our President, she is like a Guardian Angel of the Acre. She is so totally dedicated to this project. I know there are others who spend so much time, money and service, but who of us would keep tons of treasures and trash in our home & yard (2 weeks before and after yard sale) then hauling large articles or collectibles with them when they go to other sales? After the yard sale, Everett was so totally exhausted that we were worried about him, next year we must have more male help! This means EVERY man that belongs to the Chatsworth Hist. Soc.
