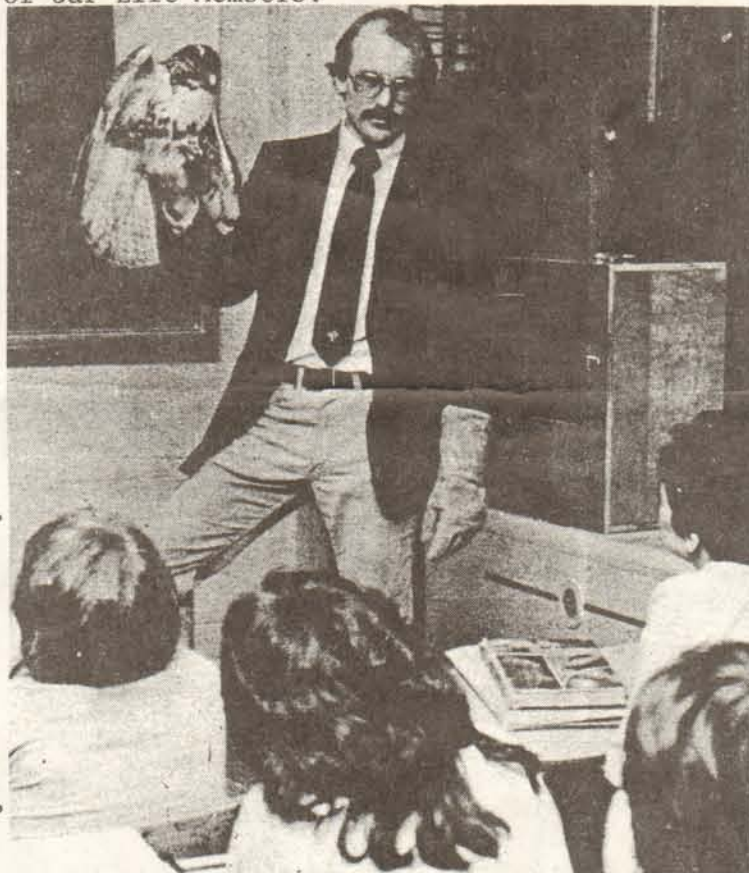

East High students learn about getting involved

Some students at East High School are so eager to get involved in their community, they spend class time helping others.

Students in the Community Involvement class receive credit for volunteering an hour each day working for a non-profit community organization.

The goal is to give students a feeling for citizen responsibility and to increase self-assuredness and self-awareness by putting the young persons into adult roles.

You might find one student at the American Diabetes Association helping the staff and volunteers organize the big spring fundraiser, the Treasure Hunt.

Another might be at an elementary school, giving one-to-one tutoring to a younger student who has fallen behind in studies.

One may be involved with peer-type counseling at the Family Connection, or help out in the nursery at the Crisis Intervention Center or

the Center for Children and Parents.

"They feel really good about themselves," says Joyce Ower, coordinator for the course. "They are giving something positive and they get positive results."

As a result of their involvement with certain programs, some students have "found" a career, and decided to pursue further education in that field.

"One student found that she enjoyed working with deaf children and is studying to be a special education teacher," says Ower.

Each student must keep a journal documenting his or her time for the week and giving an account of the week's experiences and what has been learned from them. The journal is handed in to Ower once a week.

Community Involvement is one of the elective classes offered in the Anchorage School District's School Within a School (SWS) program.

NEW ENTRY GARDEN AT THE ACRE

After years of weeds and overgrown bamboo the entrance to the Acre will present a new and pretty picture for our visitors. Twelve brilliant red "OLYMPIAD" hybrid tea roses are bordered by fifteen white "SARATOGA" floribundas. On either side, planted as a tall ground cover, the evergreen perennial Tulbagia, "SOCIETY GARLIC", with lavender blue flowers clothes the ground. Two dwarf Bearss Lime trees are planted on the west side. Because of sentimental associations the existing cedar, Mexican fan palms and seedling apricot were retained and the garden designed around them. The garden was designed to give a feeling of an old-fashioned, turn of the century bedding plant scheme with patriotic colors. Our red, white and blue garden should begin blooming in April and by the time of the Olympic games in July should be in full flower.

Candy and Dean Craig have given hours and Hours And HOURS OF TIME TO OUR GARDENS in working, digging, transplanting, planting, watering, trimming, donating plants and materials and being Docents for the gardens during Open House and other times when interested people come to visit.

If you are an office person, there is time for this exercise in the evening now that Day-light time is almost here.
