TALK FOR CHATSWORTH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

LINN C. STUCKENBRUCK

Linn Stuckenbruck will present a slide illustrated talk on World War II as recent history. He will recount his experiences in the 8th Air Force in England, where he flew in B-17s and participated in the bombing of Germany. He was shot down on his 24th mission, and spent 17 months as a German prisoner of war.

By a great stroke of luck, he was able to retrieve his camera from the Germans after liberation, and the undeveloped film was still in the camera. He was thus one of the very few people who were able to take color photographs of the prisoners and of the prison camp.

He is a charter member of the Chatsworth Historical Society, and he takes photographs and makes slides that are used for the society's slide presentations. He and his wife Marlys have lived in Chatsworth for 29 years. He has taught at USC for the past 16 years. His hobby is aviation history on which he has 10,000 slides.

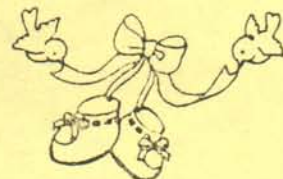
