IN MEMORY OF:

DONALD FERRIS M.D. (husband of Ruth Boak M.D.) JOE IVERSON Both were Life members of the Chatsworth Historical society. Don and Ruth were married 44 years. They were classmates in medical school.

Military services for Dr. Ferris, 79, Camarillo, were held at 2 p.m. Thursday, October 16th, at Griffin Brothers Funeral Chapel, Camarillo. Burial was at Conejo Mountain Memorial Park, Camarillo.

Dr. Ferris died Sunday in a Camarillo hospital after a long illness. He was born Oct. 2 1907, in Greenwich, Conn.. He was a 6-year county resident.

Dr Ferris lived in Chatsworth for 28 years, and retired to San Antonio, Texas, before moving to Ventura County. He was an Air Force physician for 25 years, having retired as a colonel in 1962.

He was a veteran of World War II and Korea. He was a graduate of Yale University and received his medical degree from the University School of Med. He was a member of the Retired Officers Association and was a charter member of the Chatsworth Historical Society

Full military honors were provided by the Paci-

fic Missile Test Center, Point Mugu.

He is survived by his wife, Ruth, sons Boak J. of Lakewood and Don R. of Arcata, and a daughter Kari J mess when they realized he needed hospital of Lakewood. Dr. Boak is sending us \$100.00 for his care. He died of pneumonia November 8, 1986. name to be placed on our Memorial plaque in the museum.



His grand nephew, Bob Sherman and wife, Debbie, took care of him, took to Dr's office, took him wherever he wanted to go, even the the first two days of his last 10-day ill-Joe was born June 4, 1896. He was born on the ranch in the old farm house. He was married twice. His first wife was Louise and he was married to Iva for 10 years.there were no children with either marriage. He also had a twin sister, Sena, who had been badly burned when her house caught on fire. Ironically she died only about a week from the date that, Iva, his second wife died (cont.p4)

They had two children, Ruth and Willard, both deceased. Sena, Joe's twin has a son, Adolph Baker, who is now

living in Avalon, Catalina. Bob Sherman has been generous with the Chatsworth Historical Society in allowing us to have some profits on the book, "Quiet on the Set" with pictures and stories from movies that were made on the Iverson Ranch and he, also is sending us \$100.00 to have Joe's named engraved on our Memorial Plaque in the museum. Bob is now busily writing screen plays.
