





FIRST ANNUAL GARDEN FESTIVAL


The historic Homestead Acre will provide a beautiful and appropriate setting for the Society's garden festival to be held on Sunday, May 3 from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. The Acre is located at the west end of Devonshire Street



Experts in gardening skills will provide exhibits and information including the subjects of native plants and flower arranging. Groups planning to exhibit are the San Fernando Rose Society, West Valley and Southern California Garden Clubs, the Herb Society, Chatsworth Garden Center and dried flowers by Kathy's Interiors. Sheila Watts will demonstrate arranging a bridal bouquet using roses grown at the Acre.



Docents will be on hand to direct guided tours of the museum, cottage and gardens. Vendors will display books and plants, there'll be a 'white elephant' booth, refreshments will be available and door prizes will be awarded. A donation of \$2 is suggested. 

CSUN TO FEATURE JAN HINKSTON

The Santa Susana Mountain Park Association and California State University, Northridge will present a slide lecture by Jan Hinkston tiitled, "Santa Susana Mountain Park, from Historic Corridor to Wildlife Corridor.

The event will be held at the Oviatt Library, CSUN, on Friday, May 8 at 7:30 p.m. Free parking will be available in the student lot L on the NE corner of Prairie St., and Darby Ave. The library is 200 yards east and is entered from the south.

Ms. Hinkston's presentation will include the proposed historic district in the Santa Susana Pass area as well as scenes from the whole range of the Santa Susanas that separate the three valleys of San Fernando, Santa Clarita and Simi. Ms. Hinkston founded the mountain park association in 1970 and is working to make the concept a reality before development makes it too late.
