

Located on Lankershim Boulevard directly across from the Universal Studios entrance, the building is hidden by the construction of the Metrorail subway station so watch for signs. This is a chance to celebrate history with other valley historical societies and to share our common interests.

### OBITUARY.

Bobbette Fleschler, a popular San Fernando Valley historian, curator and speaker, has died. She was 38. She was a former president of the San Fernando Valley Historical Society and president of Friends of the Library at CSUN.

Bobbette died Sunday, December 15 at the Kaiser Foundation Medical Center in Panorama City from complications of Lupus. Funeral Services were held on Wednesday, December 18. She is survived by her husband Stephen Fleschler and her daughter Aviva. Her mother, Elizabeth Cloninger, preceded her in death earlier this month.

Frequently a member of CHS, Bobbette had often shared her talents with the Society and attended most of our important events. A Chatsworth resident for nine years and a graduate of Taft High School and CSUN, Bobbette had returned to the local university to teach a Valley history course.

She was also an expert on Jewish history in the valley. "She was a very capable, knowledgeable historian who was very active," said Sy Rifkin, Fleschler's co-chairman of the Jewish History Project. (Los Angeles Times.)

Chatsworth Historical Society will miss Bobbette and sends deepest sympathy to the her family.
