August 24, 1947, Keith & Sheila Watts married in Long Beach, California. 1977, Francis Gary Powers, pilot of a U-2 spy plane shot down over the Soviet Union in 1960 was killed when his weather helicopter crashed in Los Angeles.

September 3, 1939. Hitler's army invaded Poland. Britain and France declared war on Germany, onset of World War II. On September 27, 1939, Poland surrended to Germany.

September 1954, the 'Tonight Show' made its debut with host Steve Allen.

September 14, 1914, Clayton Moore was born, aka The Lone Ranger.


