#### VALLEY VIGNETTES

Chatsworth has had many celebrities who lived in the community, but I think the family that left the most lasting impression was the Roy Rogers' family.

On Sundays when we hold Open House many people ask about the Rogers, wanting to know where they lived and other facts about them.

Telling us they are still fans or repeating stories about them.

That usually starts a conversation and we talk about when their family lived here.

They came to Chatsworth in the early 1950's and settled on a 300-acre ranch just west of Oakwood Memorial Park on Lassen Street. The area is known today as The Roy Rogers' Estates. The ranch house is still there but the acreage where Buttermilk (Dale's horse) roamed is all developed with houses and streets. Trigger Street and Dale Court are two of the reminders of the past. Soon after arriving, the family joined the small community of about 4000 people their every day activities. The family attended church services in the Methodist Church.

The children attended public school and joined the scouting program.

Dale joined the PTA and often attended school conferences like all the other mothers. She spoke for the Chatsworth Women's Club and helped out with the primary children at the Sunday School. I remember one Sunday morning going to pick up my young daughter. I stepped up on the porch of the little house behind the church where the little children met and listened to Dale playing the piano and belting out a chorus of "Jesus Loves The Little Children." In fact I think she also wrote that song. She did write many songs for children as well as the theme song, "Happy Trails" used on their television programs.

Roy went to Rotary Club and Chatsworth Chamber meetings and social events. He had an interest in the Roy Rogers' Sport Club located where Chatsworth Park South is today. The Rogers became patrons of our newly formed Chatsworth Historical Society and wrote a letter sent out to the community endorsing our new society. That helped us get new members. Later after the Methodist congregation had moved up Santa Susana Pass to a new church and we were involved in the process of saving the building, we held our Appreciation Reception at the Rogers' ranch. The reception was to thank the many people who had helped us and who had given money. It was also to thank Mr. Spinks who had finally given us the church building if we agreed to move it off his property. But we didn't get a clear message to Roy. He arrived late and thought it was a fund raiser and began asking people for donations. At our request Dale stopped him and board members have been sorry ever since that we didn't let him go on and collect a lot of money. That same day we were outside with chairs set up in rows with an aisle. Dale was seated on the aisle and during the eventful program Bullet came trotting up to her near the front to offer her a field mouse he had caught and brought to her! Much later, after we were ready to move the building three of our members. Lila Schepler, Celia Woodman and I, went up to talk to Dale about moving the building. It was not long after Debbie had been killed in a tragic bus accident. Dale said that she had been wondering what to do with the money left in Debbie's bank account and she gave us the \$1000 to start our moving fund. Our Chatsworth Historical Society started on April 17, 1963 and we are now 39 years old; Over the years we have collected a lot of memories but those memories of when we first started and when


