

## $100^{TH}$ ANNIVERSARY OF THE PIONEER CHURCH

The centennial anniversary of the Pioneer Church will be held on Sunday, October 19, 2003. The celebration will start with a procession forming in the parking lot of Oakwood Memorial Park at 2 p.m., led by Equestrian Trails, Corral 54 with a mounted color guard. The procession will then proceed to the church where the program will start at 2:30 p.m. The Rev. Anthony Rasch will be the master of ceremonies.

There will be music with a combined choral group of singers from the Chatsworth United Methodist Church and the choir from St. Mary the Virgin Anglican Church with organ accompaniment by Steve Bosworth. Jim Summers and the barbershop quartet "Sixty Something" will entertain.

Lila Schepler, who was president of CHS when the church was moved, will be the main speaker. Virginia Watson will also speak. Ed Ahlstrom, whose ancestor Ann Johnson founded the church congregation, will be present if his illness improves. Lori Mitchell, who restored one of the original stained glass windows, will also talk. State and local recognition will be given; and refreshments will be served in the Parish Hall with CHS docents serving.
