Twin Lakes Water Supply

The condition that has existed for years has finally been brought to a head by the residents of Twin Lakes and some conclusion will be made within a matter of days.

Some 25 irate residents appeared May 23 before the Public Utilities Commissioners to demand action in providing clear, drinkable water either as a public utility or from the owner of the water rights, W. E. Lawrence.

At their hearing last week they brought samples of water that flows through their pipes; Mrs. Catherine Leverton of 21403 Wahoo Trail made the statement that she was without water for three weeks last fall and then got nothing but muddy water for another two weeks.

Leonard Green of 21434 Mayan Drive complained his water bill skyrocketed during the dry period because there was air instead of



water going through the meter.

Lawrence said he would welcome control of his company by the Public Utilities Commission because many of his 64 customers have refused to pay their bills. He estimated unpaid bills at more than \$6,000 -- many of them not paid since 1949. Several residents said they would not pay until the water supply is made acceptable.

The Commission will make a thorough study of this situation and in 10 days time from May 23 Lawrence is to appear before the Commission on a hearing.

More on this later, but we certainly hope that the condition of the water will be greatly improved -- it is a terrible situation.


