IN THE PAST TWO MONTHS fires have been deliberately started on the Asbury property west of Santa Susanna Avenue by someone who, as of this writing, has not been captured. The person has been sighted but not apprehended. Everything has been completely burned to the ground except the main house and an attempt was made recently to set fire to it by igniting the mattress in the children's room which was, fortunately, unoccupied at the time. The Asbury's daughter Kay is bedridden with rheumatic fever and because of these terrible fires, has had several relapses, and was taken last Thursday to the home of her grandparents, the Leslie Johnsons, in Lancaster, for complete rest and relaxation.

Fires have been the chief threat and topic of conversation here this past week. M. Ditto home, and near the short tunnel on the railroad. The wind was blowing hard and but for the quick response of the fire departments, much damage might have been done. While one of the departments was still on these fires another call was received to go to Circle Drive at Chatsworth Lake for another fire and other small fires were discovered near the Walter Lohman Ranch, Fortunately, no homes were damaged.

Last Sunday afternoon a little girl fell from Stony Point and was taken to Northridge Hospital. In checking with them we found that her name is Joy Snow, 11, of Sepulveda. She is still at the hospital.


