## Woman's Club

Its founder, first president, and president emeritus, Mrs. Grace Hageman Armstrong, was among the past presidents honored on this day. Others present to receive their lovely carnation corsages in the club colors of pink and green were Mdms, C. E. Turner, Annette Hughes, Minnie Lanahan, F. H. Schepler, Helen Davis, Edmund Loritz, Bruce Garoutte, and Harold Sunde. Introductions were made by Mrs. R. L. Johnson, the first program chairman and a member for the entire 36 years. She told of the special achievements of each president, which incorporated a brief history of the club.

The luncheon, which carried out the Valentine theme and was climaxed with the traditional birthday cake, was served by Mrs. John Campbell, and her committee, Mdms. Roscoe Harris, Philip Zekvich, Robert Cooley, J. Dean Park, Edmund Loritz, and Glen Beyer.

Mrs. Will Wilkins, the first club secretary, gave the inspirational before the luncheon, Mrs. Tom Somerville led in the flag salute after giving a few words to remind the ladies that that day was the birthday anniversary of the great American, Abraham Lincoln.



Christians are not exempt from tribulations or afflictions, but


He gives us the inward peace and joy to bear them, knowing that these things are only for a season before being "at home" with Him.






