



Halsted Street is chairman of the committee and Rev. Harris E. Heverly of the Church Finance Advisory Service of the Congregational Board of Home Missions in New York is the Director of the CanVass.

Preparatory meetings for both men and women of the church and community are being held this week and a goal of \$20,000 in two-year pledges has been set. Loans from the Board of Home Missions will make it possible to proceed within a reasonable time to the erection of the first permanent building on the 5-acre site at Mason and Lassen Streets.

The church of which Rev. Donald W. Head and Rev. Charlotte A. Head are ministers was organized December 6, 1959, with 92 members and now has 113 members. Plans are being developed, looking forward to a membership of 1000 by 1975.

This new church is sponsored by the Congregational Conference of Southern California and the Southwest, and will be a part of the United Church of Christ which is being developed by a union with the Evangelical and Reformed denomination. It will serve as a liberal community type church serving all Protestants who care to join.




